

100 YEARS AGO: MARINES IN THE GREAT WAR

August 1918: After being pulled off the line around Soissons, the 2nd division was moved to a rest area near the beautiful city of Nancy for R & R. The Marine Brigade took into its ranks 2000 much needed replacements. By 8 August, the 2nd Division was moved back into the line at the guiet Marbache Sector to relieve a French Division. During this period, Marines were authorized to wear the Eagle, Globe, and Anchor device on their Army uniforms although it would take some time to get the new round bronze EGA collar devices made. The 2nd Division was directed to make enough noise in their sector to convince the Germans that a major attack was coming in order to distract the Germans from the Saint-Mihiel Sector where the next attack would come. Marines in the sector were subjected to German raids and artillery attacks, but suffered very few casualties. Late in August, the 2nd Division moved off the line. The Marine Brigade moved to Faviere and began weapons and small unit training to keep the old-timers sharp and to bring the replacements up to Brigade standards. On 30-31 August the entire division held maneuvers in preparation for the next big American offensive around Saint-Mihiel.



The first Eagle, Globe and Anchor collar device authorized for wear by enlisted Marines from 1918 to 1920. These discs were manufactured in the U.S., France and in Germany after the Armistice.

BURIAL HONORS FOR MICHAEL CURRY



The Alexander Bonnyman Detachment provided a funeral service and burial honors for Michael Curry on 17 August, 2018. Mike was a Marine Corps Sergeant and served from 1963 to 1967, including a tour in Vietnam. He was a Marine Corps League Life Member and a member of the Alexander Bonnyman Detachment. He died at the age of 73 in Indianapolis, Indiana.

YOUNG MARINE REPORT by Kathy Winters


The Lt Alexander Bonnyman Young Marines is very proud of our Junior Leadership graduates: YM LCP Jesse Ford, YM LCP Luke Jones, YM LCP Brock Runyan, YM CPL Natalie Throckmorton, and YM CPL Robert Throckmorton. Natalie Throckmorton also received the Molly Marine Award for being the graduating female with the highest Physical Fitness Test score. YM LCLP Luke Jones also attended the National Flight Academy at NAS Pensacola. Kudos also to YM PFC Riley Overholt for earning his Community Service Award. He graduated in March from Recruit Training, he completed his 50 hours requirement in July which included many hours at a horse rescue farm.

We have accepted a transfer of a Young Marine from San Diego Unit. We are also doing a pilot program starting one Young Marine recruit and integrating him into the Unit with another Young Marine mentor responsible for his training.


